The Irish language yesterday and today

The Irish language is alive and well in Ireland and in America in the early years of the 21st century. Once thought to be dying out completely, Irish has made an extraordinary recovery. According to Joan Kennedy, a native of County Tipperary and a speaker of Irish, several factors have aided its comeback. Among them are the educational policy of the Irish Republic in supporting the language and the designation of Irish as one of 23 official languages by the European Union.



Another factor in the United States has been the work of Joan and others. For years, she has taught the language at venues ranging from Irish organizations to Yale and Sacred Heart universities. At our August meeting, Joan will treat us to an evening of Irish. We will visit ancient Ireland and the beginnings of the language, hear and see examples of songs and poetry in Irish, and have a lesson in speaking and writing Irish. There will be no test — so come and enjoy an evening of learning about the language of our ancestors.
