

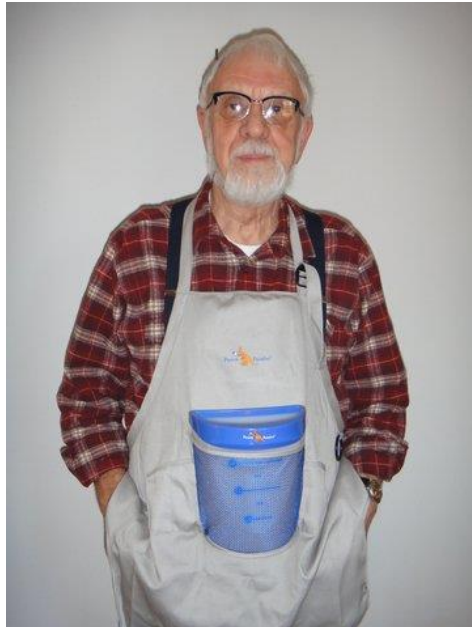

Our speaker for May is Sean O'Connor, a man with many hats: gardener, cook, teacher of Irish and a writer of Irish stories. We will hear a book of short stories, translated on the spot from Irish, entitled "*Inne Agam Mar Chiste*" or "Yesterdays are my Treasure". These are delightful stories of his family's life in Dublin during the 1940's to 1960's. He's written other kinds of stories such as the one about the space travelers marooned in Kerry and a bigger than life Irish hero. The stories we will hear are both touching and hilarious, as only the Irish can tell.

In the past, Dr. O'Connor has been involved with research at Bristol-Myers Squibb and was a co-founder of Myco Pharmaceuticals in Massachusetts. Today, he is a senior consultant, finding cost-effective and reasonable solutions.

With his roots in Dublin, and seeped in the best Gaelic language school in Ireland, he's had a rigorous education, graduating from University College Dublin with a PhD in Organic Chemistry. He's been part of the Sean Ruiseal Trilogy, a series of detective stories in modern Irish.
